I have had times in my life where things have caught me by surprise, but it's at those times when it's so clear to see the hand of God guiding, providing, and protecting.

God has assured us in His word that He takes care of us. He provides for all of our needs each day. We read, "Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your Heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they?" God takes care of all of His creation, and we are the crown jewel of it. Maybe you're facing some difficult times. Maybe the road ahead is foggy and the only thing getting you through is the white stripe. Know that it is God who provides the white stripe for his too.
