He is always ready to forgive, to love, and to restore. What happened on that hill 2,000 years ago is no less powerful today.

In the end, we can all be thankful that we still get to hear that one, still small voice. We are constantly reminded and reassured that He has risen, just as He said. No matter what voices we join, no matter what we do, the truth of Christ's victory over sin, death, and the devil is sure and certain. "O death, where is your sting? O grave, where is your victory? The sting of death is sin; and the strength of sin is the law, but thanks be to God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." (1 Cor. 15:55-57)

The victory that Jesus won on the cross is a gift for you. As you go through Holy Week, may you be blessed as you remember the voices throughout the ages, and the choir that you join singing, "To him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be praise and honor and glory and power, for ever and ever!" Rev. 5:13.
