They wanted to the one who performed miracle after miracle, including raising people from the dead, to die Himself. They wanted the one who spoke of mercy, love, forgiveness, and grace to suffer a painful, humiliating end on a wooden cross on Golgatha. What a dark day indeed.

There's an old song that comes along with Good Friday that says, "Were you there when they crucified my Lord?" As a little kid, I thought this song was a bit crazy. Of course I wasn't there. I'm not that old. I thought that maybe my grandparents were there, but I wasn't ③. After hearing this song some more, and growing a little deeper in my analytical thinking, the reality is that I was there. My sin caused a punishment that Jesus lovingly bore for me. When He was on the cross, He took my sins, my shame, my guilt and defeated it once and for all. It's dark because of the actions of humanity, myself included, that He had to pay for.

If our story ended there, there would be no hope. There would be no purpose to life. But thanks be to God, it certainly doesn't end there. In 1 Corinthians, we read, "If there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised. And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith." (1 Cor 15:13-14) With the resurrection of Christ, all things are fulfilled, and all things are true. He promised to conquer sin, death, and the devil, and this action on Good Friday did exactly that. But His promises would be incomplete without His resurrection.

I can only imagine the wonder on the eyes of those who found the empty tomb. As Mary and Mary went to the tomb that Easter Sunday morning, they went with sorrow that Jesus had died. Imagine their wonder when the angel told them that He was not there – He had risen. Their despair turned to hope. Their sorrow turned to excitement, and they had to go and tell. That same excitement, enthusiasm, and gratitude is still something that can fill our souls today. The wonder of Easter is not confined to a specific Sunday on a calendar, but it is something that fills our lives and gives purpose and meaning to us each day. Those sins that we shamefully show to God each day are defeated, and they have no power over us. The only power now is that of our Risen Lord, and it is a power that He gives to us so that we can have eternal life with Him.

Yes – today is Good Friday, and it's a solemn, mournful day. But Easter light overshadows Good Friday's sorrow and eliminates it forever. You are loved – so much that Jesus did this FOR YOU! May the joy of Easter be the compass of your life as it points Heavenward in Christ. He is risen – He is risen indeed. Alleluia!
